Background

SHARE- Centre for Resilience in Healthcare aims to become an internationally recognized research centre by reforming the quality and safety of current healthcare systems using a new and comprehensive Resilience in Healthcare (RiH) framework. An important part of becoming an internationally recognized research centre is to disseminate scientific knowledge and results using a broad spectrum of appropriate arenas. The SHARE dissemination plan (2019-2022) therefore provides both members and collaboration partners with a strategy for how and where scientific knowledge will be distributed.

Partners

SHARE currently (February 2019) engages more than 40 researchers across the three partners UiS (32 researchers), the Norwegian University of Science and Technology in Gjøvik (NTNU Gjøvik, 10 researchers), and the Norwegian Air Ambulance Foundation (SNLA, 5 researchers). In addition, 15 PhD students from different institutions across the country are affiliated with SHARE.

Overall aim 2019-2022

The aim of SHARE's four-year dissemination plan is to make research results related to quality and safety in healthcare available both nationally and internationally. It is equally important to disseminate research results to patients, stakeholders, research communities and across the society as a whole. SHARE researchers should as such recognize the importance of becoming active contributors to the public debate in popular scientific channels and in peer review journals.

In order to reach the overall aim, the dissemination plan is divided in two main areas:

- Academic contributions
- Popular science contributions

Although a variety of stakeholders can be reached through both these arenas, academic contributions are designed to reach fellow researchers and research communities, while popular science activities are designed to reach patients, stakeholders and the society as a whole.

Three large research projects

Within SHARE there are three large research projects which all have their own respective dissemination plans. These are:

The overall aim for SHARE therefore builds on the total number for these three large research projects combined with the efforts from all of the remaining researchers which all contributes in different smaller research projects. For new large research projects granted during the dissemination plan period, dissemination plans will be developed.

Academic contributions

Papers and books

For the 4-year period (2019-2022) SHARE researchers will contribute to the writing and publication of approximately five textbooks and 230 peer-reviewed articles in international and national journals, distributed as follows:

International co-publishing

SHARE researchers have an extensive network of international collaboration partners through the various research projects. Co-publishing across international borders is encouraged.

Seminars

SHARE research centre will organize annual research seminars for academic partners, empirical partners, and stakeholders, where consortium members, Scientific Advisory Board members, and leading international researchers will be invited to present state-of-the-art research on different topics.

The aim of all seminars should be to exchange knowledge between different stakeholders, and across meso, macro and micro levels. SHARE research centre will be in possession of high-quality telecommunication equipment in order to facilitate cross-national attendance on all seminars.

International conferences

International conferences are highly prioritized within SHARE research centre, and viewed as one of the most important strategies in order to become an internationally recognized research centre. SHARE researchers will therefore aim to attend a large number of conferences. At national and international leading conferences such as Nordic Conference on Research in Quality and Safety in Health Care (NSQH) and The Resilient Health Care Net Meeting (RHCN) SHARE researchers will attend in high numbers in order to make a large scientific impact. All conference attendance should be associated with oral or poster presentation.
